Item 2 Educational Background and Business Experience

Raúl Velázquez, ChFC[®], was born in 1960. He earned an MBA from the New York University Stern School of Business in May 1991 and a BA from Haverford College in May 1982. Since 2014, Mr. Velázquez has been the Senior Managing Director, Chief Compliance Officer, and an Investment Adviser Representative for Cenador Financial Advisers LLC.

With respect to capital markets, Mr. Velázquez served as a securities trader and investment banking associate at: Bear, Stearns & Company from 1976 to 1988 and from 1991 to 1993; and Lehman Brothers in 1990. During this time, he acquired unique insights on how primary and secondary markets operate. With regard to portfolio management, Mr. Velázquez worked as an Account Executive for Metropolitan Life Financial Planning Services, an insurance company, between 1988 and 1989 as well as Dean Witter Reynolds Inc., a securities brokerage firm, between 1996 and 1997. In connection with promoting entrepreneurship, Mr. Velázquez has and continues to serve as a financial management and business consultant helping survival-stage firms navigate changing market conditions through Velazquez Capital, Inc. from 1997 to 2010 and Velazquez Ventures, LLC from 2011 to the present. Finally, in terms of academic theories that impact the world of business, Mr. Velázquez served as a college adjunct lecturer in Economics and Finance, grounding his students in the principles and applying/testing those principles in practical ways that allow him to remain current with changing market dynamics (The City University of New York: 2002-2009, Monroe College: 2008-2013 & 2015-2019, and Manhattan College: 2008-2021).

Mr. Velázquez has held the designation of Chartered Financial Consultant[®] (ChFC[®]) since 2022. The ChFC[®] designation is awarded by The American College, an accredited private educational institution that offers both undergraduate and graduate training programs. Prerequisites include high school education and three years of full-time business experience within the five years preceding the awarding of the designation. Average study time to earn the ChFC[®] exceeds 450 hours, to complete the 8 required college-level courses and pass the final exam for each course. Required courses cover topics, including retirement and estate planning; insurance planning; financial process and environment, income tax planning; employee benefits planning; asset protection planning and estate tax, transfer tax, and gift tax planning; and applications of comprehensive financial planning and consulting. Certification requires 30 CE credits every two years. ChFC[®] charterholders are held to a fiduciary standard and agree to comply with The American College code of ethics and procedures.

Mr. Velázquez has been a member of the CFA Institute since 2001. He has also been a member of the CFA Society New York, a local member society of the CFA Institute, since 2002. The CFA Institute is the largest global association of investment professionals. The CFA Institute's mission focuses on the development of codes, best practice guidelines, and industry-wide standards. Members must commit to abide by, and annually reaffirm, their adherence to the CFA Institute Code of Ethics and Standards of Professional Conduct.
